Position	Board Director			
Function	As a QCC Board Director, you have the opportunity to provide leadership to the organization, optimize performance and ensure compliance with legal requirements.			
	Board members are not required to be involved in day-to-day operations, but should be aware of the activities, services and programs the organization offers.			
	QCC values a Board that is inclusive (gender, age, ethnicity, nationality, cultural needs, visible minority, and persons with special needs) and representative of the communities we serve.			
	This is a volunteer role; no remuneration is offered. Travel and other business expenses are reimbursed in accordance with established policies and guidelines.			
Primary Legal Duties	Duty of Due Care: Take care of the organization by ensuring prudent use of all assets, including facility, people, and good will; and provide oversight for all activities that advance the nonprofit's effectiveness and sustainability.			
	Duty of Loyalty: Make decisions in the best interest of the organization; not in his or her self-interest.			
	Duty of Obedience: Ensure that the organization obeys applicable laws and acts in accordance with ethical practices; that the organization adheres to its stated corporate purposes, and that its activities advance its mission.			
Term	Directors shall be elected for a term of three (3) years by Members entitled to vote at a meeting of the Members, following the Annual General Meeting (AGM) September 26 th , 2019			
	No Director may be elected for more than three (3) consecutive full terms or nine (9) years.			

Position Requirements		
Competencies	At this time, the Board requires an experienced director with a mix of both strategic and business competencies. Given the Board's current composition, leadership experience in any of the following areas is needed:	
	 Insurance experience (particularly Affinity partner development and management experience); Change Management/ Transformation experience; 	



	 Membership Association experience;
	 Governance experience with the Broader Public Service or Non-Profit Sector
Commitments	 Commitment to prepare for and attend meetings on a regular basis. A time commitment of approximately 2-3 hours per month. This includes attending Board meetings (held 4-5 times over the course of the year in the GTA, usually a half day meeting (combination of in-person or teleconference meetings) including a one-day strategic planning meeting, an AGM held in the evening and relevant sub-committee meetings). Willingness to serve on at least one sub-committee and participate actively in its work. Be informed of the services/projects undertaken by QCC and support the organization publicly when called upon. Be aware of and abstain from any conflict of interest.
Attributes	 Integrity and high ethical standards Intellectual capacity for conceptual and strategic thinking Ability to cut through complex issues and ask incisive questions Independent judgment Candour and the willingness to table difficult issues Willingness to act on and be accountable for decisions The interpersonal skills to work collegially within and outside QCC, and to express views in a way that is both challenging and supportive
